

SUNCHASERS TRAVEL CLUB STANDARDS

- ALCOHOL** Alcoholic intoxication is not permitted and shall be subject to loss of membership.
- CAMERAS** Non members and guests are not permitted to take photos. Written consent of guardians is required to photograph children. Permission to photograph any person is required. A written release is required for photos to be published.
- CHILDREN** Children under 18 are automatic members when sponsored by an AANR registered guardian. They are subject to these standards. Guardians are responsible at all times for safety and conduct. Over 18 must be registered as adults.
- CLOTHING** All scheduled activities are nude events except where unreasonable to do so.
- COMPLAINTS** Legitimate complaints must be made to management in writing. When immediate action is required a verbal complaint to management can be made.
- CONDUCT** Conduct at SUNCHASERS sponsored activities should reflect the moral standards of a family activity.
- DRUGS** Drugs and their use are not permitted and shall be subject to loss of membership.
- FIREARMS** Display or use of firearms is not permitted.
- GARBAGE** If you carry it in, carry it out.
- GUEST** Guest are subject to SUNCHASERS standards. Members are responsible for instructing guests of the standards.
- PETS** Owners are responsible for the control of and damage done by their pets.
- RULES** Activities held at other facilities are subject to posted rules which override SUNCHASERS standards.
- SINGLES** A reasonable balance of single female and male members will be maintained.
- TOWELS** Please use YOUR OWN TOWEL to sit on at all times.

Nudist Etiquette

There are a few considerations of etiquette, accepted among nudists. They are listed here for reference and for the benefit of newcomers.

It is a good idea to secure an invitation before dropping in on nudist clubs. This usually means writing, e-mail or telephoning ahead of time. Strangers who show up unexpectedly may be turned away.

Honesty is the best policy. If you are sincere most clubs will be happy to have you visit. Deceptive stories about why you want to become a nudist are not necessary. Give accurate information in your initial correspondence to a club and on your membership application. Be as friendly and open as possible and others will do the same.

Married couples must join with their spouses. Some clubs have a "no singles" policy while others are more liberal toward single members. It's always better to ask in advance rather than risk being turned away at the gate. In most instances single couples (male and female) visiting a club together are just as welcome as married couples.

For business or personal reasons some nudists wish to remain anonymous and will introduce themselves using first names only. You should respect their privacy and they will do the same to you. It is you that nudist care about. Your personality and behavior will determine the number of friends you make at a nudist park, just as at any other social function.

Nudist parks seek to maintain a family atmosphere. Innocent expressions of affection among family members and friends are commonplace, but overt sexuality is not condoned. Unseemly behavior of any kind is out of place and will not be tolerated.

Photography is usually taboo. All clubs have strict rules governing photography. Most nudists are camera-shy and it is inexcusable to take a photo of anyone without permission. Don't take your camera or camera cell phone to a club without checking all the club rules governing photography.

Observe all the clubs posted rules. They are for your protection as well as for the safety and enjoyment of all concerned.

Some of the more common rules are simple. Watch your children, they are your responsibility at all times; sit on towels for sanitary reasons; shower carefully before using swimming pool or hot tub; respect the rights of others; respect the club property and help keep it clean; leave your pets at home.
